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Methodology

Respondent Criteria	Respondents are senior residents of Paris, ME.
Data Collection	Mail Survey administered by volunteers of Paris, Maine participating in the AARP Network of Age-Friendly Communities.
Respondent Counts	 n=316 completed surveys out of 1,000 mailed (239 returned due to bad addresses, no mail receptacle, etc.) Overall response rate: 31.6% Adjusted response rate (remove undeliverable mailings from base): 41.5%
Research Caveat	This report provides many useful insights with reasonable sample sizes.
Questionnaire	 Structured questionnaire containing 35 questions. Questions focused on the community, housing, outdoor spaces and buildings, transportation and streets, health and wellness, social participation, inclusion and education opportunities, volunteering and civic engagement, job opportunities, and community information.



Methodology: Sample Segments

• A random sample size of n=316 yields a maximum sampling error of +/- 5.5 percentage points at the 95% level of confidence. That is, if the reported percentage is 50%, one can be 95% confident that the percentage for the entire population would fall within the range of 44.5% and 55.5%. Sample tolerances for smaller subgroups are broader.




Community Rating

- About two-fifths (37%) of respondents rated their community "excellent" or "very good" as a place for people to live as they age.
- One-third of respondents (33%) rated their community "good" as a place to live as they age.
- Just under one-third (30%) of respondents rated the community "fair," or "poor."




Time In the Community

- One in twelve respondents (8%) have lived in the community for less than 5 years.
- One-third (32%) have lived in the community for 5 to 25 years.
- One-quarter (28%) have lived in the community for 25 to 45 years.




Residence

Q3. Some people reside in places outside of their state for part of the year. Which of the following describes how you reside in your state? (Aided, single response)




Likelihood of Moving Within the Community

- One in seven (15%) respondents are "extremely likely" or "very likely" to move to a different home in their community.
- One in nine (11%) respondents are "somewhat likely" to move within their community.
- Over three-fifths (63%) of respondents are "not very likely" (28%) or "not at all likely" (35%) to move to a different home within their community in their retirement years.
- One in nine (11%) respondents are not sure.




Likelihood of Moving Outside the Community

- One sixth (17%) of respondents are "extremely likely" (9%) or "very likely" (8%) to move to a different home outside their community.
 - Respondents who provided a "fair" or "poor" rating for their community as a place for people to live as they age are significantly more likely than those who provided a "good" to "excellent" rating to say they are "extremely" (18% vs. 5%), "very" (13% vs. 6%), and "somewhat likely" (27% vs. 15%) to move to a different home outside of their community.
- Over one-half (54%) of respondents are "not very likely" (23%) or "not at all likely" (31%) to move to a different home outside their community in their retirement years, while one-fifth (18%) are "somewhat likely."




Factors Impacting the Decision to Move

• The most important factors impacting respondents' decisions about moving out of their community are a home that will help them live independently (67%), an area that has a lower cost of living (61%), maintaining their current home will be too expensive (56%), and looking for a different home size that meets their needs (51%).




Other Factors Impacting the Decision to Move

- Three-fifths (60%; 22 of 37*) of respondents who provided an additional reason cited high taxes as a factor impacting their decision to move.
- One-sixth (16%; 6 of 37*) would consider the availability of assisted living and/or senior housing.




Importance of Remaining in the Community

- One-half (52%) of respondents feel it is "extremely important" (21%) or "very important" (31%) to remain in their community as they age, and over one-quarter (27%) feel it is "somewhat important."
- One-fifth (21%) feel it is "not very important" (13%) or "not at all important" (8%) to remain in their community as they age.




Housing



Primary Home

- Over four-fifths (84%) of respondents own their home. One in eight (13%) rent their home, and a small percentage (3%) have another type of living arrangement.
- Three-quarters (76%) of respondents live in a single family home, while one in eight (12%) live in an apartment, and one in twelve (8%) live in a mobile home.

Q8.Do you own or rent your primary home or do you have some other type of living arrangement like living with a family member or friend? (Aided, single response)



• Most (91%) of respondents feel it is "extremely important" (58%) or "very important" (33%) to be able to live independently in their own home as they age.



Home Modifications

- Nearly one-half (46%) of respondents feel they will need bathroom modifications such as grab bars, handrails, higher toilet or non-slip tile in order to stay in their home. This is followed by installing a medical emergency response system (38%) and creating easier access into or within their home (29%).
- One-fifth of respondents feel improving lighting (21%) and putting a bedroom, bathroom and kitchen on the first floor (19%) are important.




Other Home Modifications



Importance of Specific Aspects of the Community

- Most (93%) respondents feel home repair contractors who are trustworthy, do quality work, and are affordable are "extremely important" (59%) or "very important" (34%).
- Over four-fifths of respondents feel seasonal services (85%), a home repair service for low-income and older adults (83%), well-maintained and safe low-income housing (83%), and affordable housing options for adults at varying income levels (81%) are "extremely important" or "very important."

Importance of Specific Aspects of the Community





Availability of Specific Aspects of the Community

- The availability of specific aspects of the community do not align well with the perceived importance of the aspects.
- One-half of respondents say their community has home repair contractors who are trustworthy, do quality work, and are affordable (47%), and/or well-maintained and safe low-income housing (47%).
- Over one-half (58%) of respondents agreed their community has well-maintained homes and properties yet it was last in terms of importance.




Importance of Specific Aspects in the Community

- Over four-fifths of respondents feel that having well-maintained public buildings and facilities that are accessible to people of different physical abilities (85%) and sidewalks that are in good condition, free from obstruction, and are safe for pedestrian use and accessible for assistive mobility devices (83%) in the community are "extremely important" or "very important."
- Three-quarters (75%) of respondents feel that having well-maintained public restrooms that are accessible to people of different physical abilities is "extremely important" or "very important."



Availability of Specific Aspects in the Community

- The availability of specific aspects of outdoor spaces and buildings could align better with perceived importance of the aspects.
- Over two-fifths of respondents feel well-maintained public buildings and facilities that are accessible to people of different physical abilities (45%) are available in their community.
- Only about one-fifth of respondents think their community has sidewalks that are in good condition, (23%) and well-maintained public restrooms that are accessible to people of different physical abilities (20%).




How You Get Around

- Most (92%) respondents drive themselves for things like shopping, visiting the doctor, running errands, or going to other places, by far the most common way respondents get around town.
- One-quarter or more of respondents walk (28%) and/or have others drive them (25%).
- One in eleven respondents (9%) ride a bicycle.



Importance of Specific Aspects in the Community

- Most respondents feel it is "extremely" (48%) or "very important" (43%) for their community to have well-maintained streets (91%), well-lit, safe streets and intersections for all users (89%), easy to read traffic signs (89%), special transportation services (84%), and enforced speed limits (84%).
- Just two-fifths (43%) of respondents feel having driver education/refresher courses is "extremely important" or "very important."



Availability of Specific Aspects in the Community

- Availability of transportation and street attributes in the community do not align with the perceived importance of the attributes.
- Just one-third (32%) of respondents feel their community has well-maintained streets, while three-fifths (58%) feel it does not.
- Two-fifths (37%) of respondents feel their community has well-lit, safe streets and intersections for all users, a similar percentage as those who do not (38%).
- Over two-thirds (71%) of respondents feel their community has easy to read traffic signs.




Personal Health

- Three-fifths (60%) of respondents rate their health as "excellent" (27%) or "very good" (33%) compared to most people their age, and one-quarter (27%) rate their health as "good."
- Few (3%) respondents rate their health as "poor" compared to most people their age.




Frequency of Physical Exercise

- Nearly one-third (31%) of respondents engage in some form of physical exercise every day.
- Over two-fifths (43%) of respondents engage in some form of physical exercise several times a week, but not every day.


Q20. How often do you engage in some form of physical exercise (such as walking, running, biking, swimming, sports, strength training, yoga, stretching)? (Aided, single response)



Importance of Specific Aspects in the Community

- Each of the health and wellness aspects included in the research are considered important by at least seven in ten respondents.
- Nearly all respondents consider having respectful and helpful hospital and clinic staff (96%), well-maintained hospitals and health care facilities (96%), and/or a variety of health care professionals including specialists (94%) in their community to be "extremely important" or "very important."







Availability of Specific Aspects in the Community

- The perceived importance and availability of health and wellness aspects in the community align better than do some of the other categories of community features.
- The majority of respondents feel their community has respectful hospital and clinic staff (83%), well-maintained hospitals and health care facilities (87%), a variety of health care professionals including specialists (73%), and conveniently located emergency care centers (78%).
- Just three in ten feel their community has affordable home health care providers (30%) and/or fitness activities geared towards older adults (29%).


Social Participation, Inclusion and Education Opportunities

• Respondents seem to have frequent interaction. Over two-fifths (42%) of respondents interact with people in the community more than once a day. This is followed by about once a day (20%) and several times a week (24%).


Q24. Where do you typically go for continuing education or self-improvement classes/workshops in your community? (Aided, multiple responses)



Importance of Specific Aspects in the Community

- Four-fifths (80%) of respondents feel it is "extremely important" (35%) or "very important" (45%) to have activities that are affordable to all residents in their community.
- Over two-thirds of respondents consider activities that offer senior discounts (73%), accurate and widely publicized information about social activities (72%), and activities that involve both younger and older people (68%) "extremely important" or "very important" to have in their community.




Availability of Specific Aspects in the Community

- The perceived importance of participation, inclusion and education opportunities do not align well
 with what is believed to be available.
- Only about one-fifth of respondents say their community has activities that are affordable to all residents (20%), and/or activities that offer senior discounts (21%), yet these are perceived to be the two most important aspects according to respondents.
- Conversely, continuing education classes are considered important to the second lowest percentage of respondents but over two-thirds (69%) believe they are available, the highest percentage of the participation, inclusion and education opportunities included in the research.

Q26. Does the community where you live have the following?




Volunteering and Civic Engagement



Importance of Specific Aspects in the Community

- Two-thirds (71%) of respondents consider transportation to and from volunteer activities for those who need it "extremely important" (27%) or "very important" (44%).
- Three-fifths of respondents feel it is "extremely" or "very important" to have easy to find information on available local volunteer opportunities in their community (63%).



- Just one in nine (11%) respondents think transportation to and from volunteer activities for those
 who need it is available in their community, and only one in eight (12%) feel there is easy to find
 information on available local volunteer opportunities.
- One-third (31%) of respondents feel there are opportunities for older adults to participate in decision making bodies such as community councils or committees in their community and over one-quarter (29%) believe a range of volunteer activities to choose from exist in their community.




Employment Status

Q29. Which of the following best describes your current employment status?




Likelihood of Continuing to Work

- Three-fifths (59%) of respondents are "extremely likely" (39%) or "very likely" (20%) to continue to work as long as possible rather than choosing to retire.
- One in eight (13%) respondents are "somewhat likely" to continue to work as long as possible.
- One-quarter (26%) of respondents are "not very likely" or "not at all likely" to continue to work as long as possible.



 Two-thirds or more respondents feel jobs that are adapted to meet the needs of people with disabilities (75%), a range of flexible job opportunities for older adults (72%), and job training opportunities for older adults (69%) are "extremely important" or "very important" to have in their community.




Availability of Specific Aspects in the Community

- Few respondents believe any of the job-related opportunities are available in their community. The majority are not sure if the job-related opportunities exist in their community.
- Only one in ten (10%) respondents feel their community has jobs that are adapted to meet the needs of people with disabilities.
- Few respondents feel their community has a range of flexible job opportunities for older adults (7%) or job training opportunities for older adults (9%).





Importance of Specific Aspects in the Community

- Three-quarters of respondents consider it "extremely important" or "very important" to have free access to computers and the internet in public places in their community (73%) and access to community information in one central source (73%).
- Over three-fifths of respondents consider it "extremely important" or "very important" to have community information delivered in person (66%), clearly displayed printed community information with large lettering (65%), and an automated community information source that is easy to understand (63%).



- Nearly two-thirds (65%) of respondents say they have free access to computers and the internet in public places.
- Few respondents say they have access to community information in one central source (6%), community information delivered in person (5%), clearly displayed printed community information (3%), or an automated community information source that is easy to understand (4%). Most are unsure about the availability of these community resources.




Most Critical Issue to be Improved

• Three-fifths (60%) of respondents who provided an additional comment cited taxes as the most critical issue to be improved in order to remain in their home, followed distantly by health care choices (10%), home repairs and maintenance (10%), and public transportation (8%).



Most Important Services

Respondent Profile



Respondent Profile

- More women (64%) than men (36%) are represented in the respondent base.
- The majority of respondents are between 55 and 84 years of age: 55 to 64 (27%), 65 to 74 (35%), and 75 to 84 (21%).
- One-half (52%) of respondents are married. About one-fifth each are widowed (20%) and divorced (17%).
- One-half (52%) of respondents are AARP members.
- Two-thirds (69%) of respondents have no disabilities.
- One-quarter of respondents each have a high school diploma (28%), post-high school education/training with no degree (23%), and a 2 or 4 year college degree (24%). One-fifth (21%) have a graduate or professional degree.
- Over two-fifths (44%) of respondents access the internet several times a day, while one in six (15%) access the internet about once a day. One-quarter (27%) never go online.
- Two-fifths of respondents each have household incomes between \$10,000 and less than \$30,000 (40%) and \$30,000 to less than \$75,000 (39%). One in eight (12%) have household incomes of \$75,000 or more, and one in eleven (9%) have incomes less than \$10,000.
- One in six (15%) respondents have another adult living in their household, and one in ten (10%) have a child or children 18 or older in their household.
- Two-thirds (66%) of respondents have Medicare, two-fifths (40%) have insurance through a current or former employer, and one-third (35%) have insurance purchased directly from an insurance company.




