at the following described location and in accordance with the provisions of Title 30-A, Sections 3751 to 3760, Chapter 183.

A. Operation Standards:

In order for an automobile graveyard, automobile recycling business and/or junk yard to be given a permit you must meet the following standards:

- The site of the yard must be enclosed by a visual screen that complies with the screening requirements.
- A vehicle containing fluids may not be stored with 100 feet of any body of water or freshwater wetland, as defined by Title 38, section 436-A, subsection 5.
- A vehicle may not be dismantled or stored within 500 feet of a school, church, cemetery or public playground or park that existed on the date the permit was issued.
- A vehicle may not be stored in a Well Head Protection Area.
- A vehicle may not be dismantled or stored over a sand and gravel aquifer or aquifer recharge area.
- A vehicle containing fluids may not be dismantled or stored within the 100-year flood plain.
- A vehicle may not be dismantled or stored within 300 feet of a well that serves as a public or private water supply, excluding a private well that serves only the automobile graveyard, automobile recycling business and/or junk yard or the owner or operator's abutting residence.
- A vehicle may not be located or dismantled closer than 20 feet from any lot line, unless the operator has notarized written permission from the abutting property owner.
- Dismantling of a vehicle must be performed in accordance with the following standards
 - Batteries must be removed
 - All fluids, including but not limited to engine lubricant, transmission fluid, brake fluid, power steering fluid, hydraulic fluid, engine coolant, gasoline, diesel fuel and oil, must be drained into watertight, covered containers and must be recycled or disposed of in accordance with applicable federal and state laws, rules and regulations.
 - Fluids from a vehicle may not be permitted to flow or be discharged into or onto the ground.
