IMPORTANT POLICIES

- · CLEAR BAGS MANDATORY
- NO BLACK BAGS (or bags of any other color)
- ◆ Black bags will be assessed a \$5.00 fee or \$129 per ton— no exceptions
- Stop at compactor office for assessment, payment & receipt
- NPSW sticker is required for vehicles (see compactor attendant)
- Please bag loose trash—ESPECIALLY GLASS
- Please roll or fold tarps and tie or tape tarps before disposal
- Rugs & Linoleum <u>must be cut to 2 x 2</u> and preferably taped for no-charge disposal
- Needles must be in taped laundry detergent or other hard plastic containers marked "NEEDLES" to dispose of in compactor.
 No needles in containers at Recycle Center.
- Glass jars & bottles, dishes, drinking glasses, pottery, ceramics, and china are now all disposed of in the compactor. Window glass, pane glass, mirrors, etc. are disposed of in the Construction Bin.

MANDATORY RECYCLING

- Cardboard (corrugated and noncorrugated), newspaper, mail, junk mail, catalogs, magazines, books, office & computer paper, envelopes, #2 plastic (natural & colored), tin and aluminum cans (no foil) and accepted metals MUST BE RECYCLED
- Shredding services available—call for schedule
- Loads may be checked by attendant and may be refused for non-separation of recyclables or any unauthorized items
 TRAFFIC POLICIES
- ◆ 5 MPH Speed Limit— watch traffic patterns
- Cones at end of compactor roof are not a lane
- Vehicles must enter facility at entrance and leave from facility exit
- ◆ Facility entrance must be used to access Brush Pile (2-way traffic sign is for Highway Department only)

- Rechargeable batteries from power tools, cell phones, ipads, laptops, hard drive towers, televisions, etc.
- Fluorescent, neon, HID, halogen, or sodium vapor light bulbs
- Mercury thermometers, thermostats, barometers, switches
- PCB ballast from old light fixtures
- NONE OF THE ABOVE ARE PERMITTED IN THE METAL BIN

Food Waste: (includes bacon grease): Green lift top containers at compactor

Cooking Oil: Pour oil into black barrels next to Food Waste

Waste MOTOR OIL ONLY; Must pass contaminant test Leave at Waste Motor Oil Tank other side of compactor

Scrap Metal/Metal Bin: Appliances without freon: microwaves, toasters, toaster ovens, etc., light tin and iron, heavy iron, cast iron, aluminum, copper, brass, etc.

*ABSOLUTELY NONE OF THE FOLLOWING MATERIAL IS PERMITTED IN THE METAL BIN: paint, empty paint cans, batteries, electronics (tvs, monitors, laptops, ipads, hard drive towers, printers, scanners, cell phones, battery packs, PCBs, etc.)

Universal Waste Accepted: Fluorescent bulbs, rechargeable batteries, ballast, items containing mercury, televisions, monitors, hard drive towers, printers, scanners, laptops, i-pads, cell phones, hand-held games, etc. (Blue Building Attendants direct/assist)

Brush Pile: (Facility entrance must be used to access Brush Pile)
Branches, limbs, logs, stumps, and Christmas trees. Clean wood pallets (unpainted) must be stacked in "pallet pile" down at BRUSH AREA.
*ABSOLUTELY NONE OF THE FOLLOWING MATERIAL IS PERMITTED IN THE BRUSH PILE: Ashes, leaves, grass clippings, wood, sawdust, shavings, hay or manure.

Leaf Bin: (April 1st—December 1st ONLY): Leaves, grass clippings, hay (no manure), pine needles, acorns, natural yard waste. Bin is located in the hard top "yard" by the Brown Building. Leaf bin must be loaded from "yard"- not below on the exit road.

(NPSW, Inc. is not a substitute for proper manure management)

Ashes: in metal barrels (when available) on a pallet at the back area of the Blue Recycle Building

PLEASE RECYCLE PROPERLY!

PLEASE BUY RECYCLED PRODUCTS WHENEVER POSSIBLE

MANDATORY RECYCLING

Loads may be checked by attendant and may be refused for non-separation of recyclables or any unauthorized items

The following MUST BE RECYCLED:

- Cardboard (corrugated and noncorrugated), brown and gray inside
- Newspaper, mail, junk mail, catalogs, magazines, paperback books, and cardboard white all the way through (Example: Little Debbie and Drake's snacks)
- #2 plastic only (natural & colored)
 Separate at specific locations for disposal
- Office, computer, and copy paper, envelopes (with & without windows), lined writing & notebook paper, manila folders & envelopes, other writing paper
- Tin Cans
- Aluminum Cans
- Other accepted metals (Metal bin)
- Lightbulbs and Electronics: See attendant
- Shredding services available—call for schedule

GLASS may now be disposed of in your household trash. Glass must be bagged.

ALUMINUM CANS

We do require rinsing, please.

NO:

- Tin cans
- Aluminum foil
- Aluminum pie plates
- Aluminum trays
- Aluminum roasting pans
- *A magnet is provided at the tin and aluminum bins
 *Tin will stick to the magnet, aluminum will not

SORTED OFFICE PAPER

• Place loose or shredded in bags into the container.

Sorted Office Paper includes:

- Office, computer and copier paper
- White and colored writing paper (NO CONSTRUCTION PAPER or COLORED POSTER BOARD)
- Lined paper and notebook paper
- Adding machine tape
- Manila envelopes (No bubble or foam-TRASH)
- Manila folders (no colored folders)
- Envelopes with or without windows
- (Staples are okay)

NO:

- Shredded newspaper or magazines
- Pendeflex files, spirals, or binder clips
- Binders
- © Calendars

GLASS-NOW IN TRASH

Glass items may now be disposed of as part of your household trash. Glass <u>must be bagged</u> with your household trash. <u>Unbagged glass is a safety hazard</u>.

Please bag & dispose of in the compactor:

- Glass containers/jars from store shelves
- Clear, brown, or green bottles
- · Ceramics, china, pottery, and porcelain
- Decorative serving platters, etc.
- NO WINDOW GLASS, PANE GLASS or MIRRORS (Pay for window glass, pane glass & mirrors at compactor office and dispose of in Construction Bin)

The following is Construction and Fee-based:

- Window glass and pane glass
- ♦ Mirrors
- ♦ Shower/bathtub doors

BOOK PALLET

Place hard-cover books only on the book shelf, please

TIN CANS

• We do require rinsing, please.

NO:

- ♦ Aluminum cans (These go in "Aluminum")
- ♦ Metal Utensils (These items go in the metal bin)
- ♦ Pots and Pans (These items go in the metal bin)

NEWSPAPER, MAGAZINES, AND JUNK MAIL

White through and through cardboard:

- Some frozen pizza boxes
- Butter & margarine
- Dental products & some toothpaste
- Some soap boxes
- Some pudding boxes
- Little Debbie & Drake's snack boxes
- Other processed food boxes

Other items:

- Paper egg cartons (NOT Styrofoam or plastic)
- Newspaper
- Magazines
- Catalogs
- Junk mail
- Ad inserts
- Political flyers
- White paper-lined bags (example: sugar)
- No bags with handles
- Paperback books

The following are TRASH:

- *Greeting cards
- *Wrapping paper
- *Colored tissue paper
- *Glossy gift bags
- *Colored construction paper
- *Carbon paper

PLEASE REMEMBER:

The Recycle Center **DOES NOT** accept used paper towels, toilet tissue, tissues, paper plates, paper cups, ice-cream containers or any take-out food containers for recycling.

CORRUGATED & NON-CORRUGATED CARDBOARD

Brown or gray cardboard; corrugated or non-corrugated

- Brown or gray processed food boxes such as cereal, pasta, cookies, crackers, etc.
- Six pack containers
- Soda boxes
- Tissue boxes
- Some dairy boxes
- Gift and shoe boxes (Nothing waxy)
- Paper towel and toilet tissue cores
- Brown paper-lined pet food bags
- Brown mailing envelopes (No bubble or foam-TRASH)
- Paper bags
- Cardboard boxes (EMPTY of STYROFOAM & PLASTIC)
- Etc., etc.

No take-out pizza boxes! No take-out pizza boxes! Take-out pizza boxes are trash!

No take-out food boxes of any kind due to food waste and oil contaminants!

PLEASE REMEMBER:

NO STYROFOAM, PLASTIC, OR OTHER CONTAMINANTS

The Recycle Center <u>DOES NOT</u> accept used paper towels, toilet tissue, tissues, paper plates, paper cups, or any take-out food containers for recycling.

NATURAL PLASTIC: #2 ONLY

LOOK IN THE TRIANGLE ON THE BOTTOM OF CONTAINER

*Place in the window on the wall where examples are hanging

Natural #2 Plastic includes, but is not limited to:

- Water jugs
- Some kitty litter containers
- Some cleaner containers (please remove spray unit)
- Some dishwashing liquid (but not many)
- Some drink containers

COLORED PLASTIC: #2 ONLY

LOOK IN THE TRIANGLE ON THE BOTTOM OF CONTAINER

*Place in the bin where examples are hanging

Colored # 2 Plastic includes, but is not limited to:

- Detergent containers (watch out for # 7 plastic)
- Bleach
- Milk
- Some kitty litter containers
- Coffee containers
- Some cleaner containers (please remove spray unit)

NEVER INCLUDE:

- Plastic soda bottles
- Whip topping and margarine tubs
- Octtage cheese & ice cream tubs
- Plastics #1, #3, #5, and #7 —these are trash
